5) Be specific. Comments in the margin such as “vague,” “confusing,” and “good” do not help students improve their writing. In fact, many students find these comments “vague” and “confusing”—and sometimes abrupt or harsh.

Writing comments on student papers is something of an art: it requires a little thought and practice for the comments to be effective—that is, both read and attended to. The following recommendations about writing comments were developed for students in writing and literature

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classes; however, with a little adjustment, they can be applied to any writing assignment.

Recommendations for Writing Comments on Student Papers

Think about the sorts of comments that you find helpful and unhelpful. For example, avoid one-word comments such as “good,” “unclear,” or “awkward.”

Tell students upfront what you will be looking for in their papers. Then keep this focus in mind when formulating comments on each paper. If you’re concentrating on argument, provide direct feedback on each student’s argument. For example: “Your argument is strong, clearly stated, and supported by ample evidence.”.

Rewrite the paragraph to clarify whether this paper is focusing on the rhetoric of the event (eg "lies" and "gave the message that. . .") or the sociological aspects of the event (eg "not allowing outsiders to participate").

Strategy #1: End Notes (or Head Notes) and Marginal Comments. As described above, one very common approach to commenting on student papers is to combine end notes that provide a “big picture” perspective with marginal comments that illustrate specific instances of the strengths and weaknesses described in the end notes.

Guidelines for providing feedback to assignments

The following sample end comments correspond to the marginal comments listed in the previous section: ... You might explain to your audience that as a student of public schools and the son of two parents involved in public school education, you have strong reasons to agree with Anyon's ideas and implications.

Sample End Comments

Make a succinct final comment and ask the student to come to your office and discuss a strategy for improvement. When possible, offer the chance to rewrite for re-grading. Ask students to hand in the old version along with the rewritten one; then average the old and new marks. Ask also for a

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note on the strategies used in revising.

Responding to Student Papers Effectively and Efficiently ...

These comments have two main purposes: to show students that you attentively read the paper and to help students understand the connection between the paper and your final comments. If you tell a student in the final comment that he or she needs more analysis, for example, the student should be able to locate one or more specific sites in the text that you think are lacking.

Responding to a student's paper involves (1) reading it carefully while making marginal comments, (2) writing a final comment in which you sum up the paper's strengths and weaknesses, then (3) deciding on a grade. Below are suggestions for accomplishing each of these tasks. 1.

Responding to Student Writing

The general comments explain my expectations and elaborate on how essays could be better. I say in my feedback that if my specific comments don't say anything about a particular aspect of the assignment, then the student should look to the general comments. This approach avoids the need to write the same comments on essay after essay.
